Taking center stage at this year's Festival is a series of recyclable cardboard origami crane sculptures, co-created by patients and the community to commemorate JurongHealth Campus' 15th Anniversary. Inspired by the perseverance of patients who found strength and purpose to live life to the fullest, with the support of family and community, the installation of 15 cranes, in different colours and sizes – some as big as 2 metres, are displayed across the 3 hospital towers. 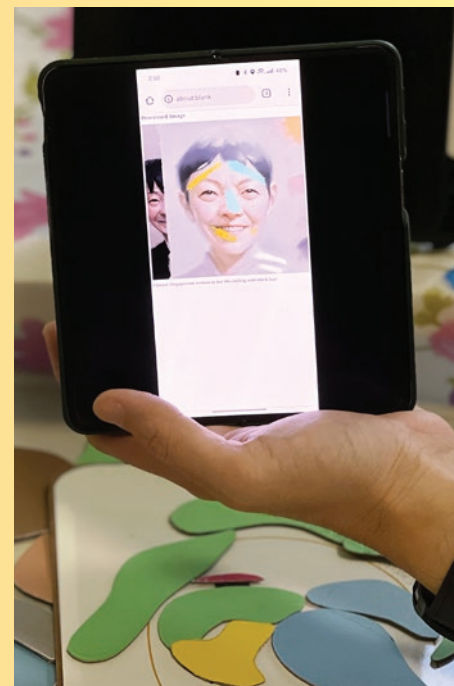


Whimsical Encounters

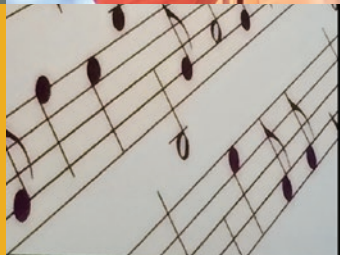
